To quote O'Keeffe, "It is breathtaking as one rises up over the world one has been living in—looking out at—and look(ing) down at it stretching away and away...it is very handsome way off into the level distance, fantastically handsome—like marvelous rug patterns or maybe Abstract Paintings." 



This workshop brings together area middle school students to create a collaborative sculpture for the corner of 4th and Main St. in downtown Cedar Falls. Students will work together to create small scale models of sculptures that represent their community. Professional artists, UNI art faculty and students, and Hearst staff will be on hand to guide students as they explore their ideas and learn about the art making process as well as how public art comes to be. Students will present their maquettes to community members where one will be selected to be fabricated in stainless steel and installed in downtown Cedar Falls.
